

Same Text Different Levels

Oftentimes we want our students to read similar content, but have a hard time finding text that meets the needs of all our learners. [Newsela](#) is a website many of us are familiar with as a place to find differentiated nonfiction text. This site offers articles about current events that are written at 4-5 different Lexile levels. Teachers can choose an article and all students can participate in the reading and learning, even though they may be at different reading levels. While Newsela is our most favorite tool for finding the same text at different levels, there are a couple more options you may want to check out.

[News in Levels](#) offers the same text at different levels; however, the articles are not leveled by Lexile. Instead, these articles are simply leveled 1, 2, and 3. We suggest you preview these articles before using them to make sure meaning is not lost in the most simple levels.

[For the Teachers](#) is another resource that contains the same nonfiction text at different levels. These articles are also leveled 1, 2, and 3. The most simple level of these articles is still quite a bit lengthy, but the text is simple. All in all, these are three good resources that offer some flexibility in choosing text for students.
