

“Google Forms” allows you to easily create a variety of forms to use with your students. These can range from forms for collecting contact information to forms that assess understanding. A variety of question types are available, such as paragraph text, multiple choice, scale, grid, etc.

You can create linear forms that house all your questions on one page. Another available format allows you to group questions on a designated page. You can also create forms that include page breaks, which take your students to various pages within the form, based on their answer choices.

Once students submit their responses, Google analyzes the data and provides awesome graphs, charts, summaries etc. This data allows you to easily see how your students are progressing. It is an awesome assessment tool.

While “Google Forms” has been around for awhile, Google has recently made some changes. For example, you can now attach an image to a question. You can also have several teachers collaborating on the same google form. “Google Forms” keep getting better.
