

Kindergarten Quarantine Directions:

My child is in quarantine. What should I do?

1. Contact your child's teacher via Dojo or email. Response time will typically be faster via Dojo due to the ease of checking on our phones. Communicate the length of time your child will be gone and how much work they will be able to handle during this time. This would be a great time to communicate any family situations for daily work time that may need to be addressed.
2. Look at Class Dojo for Parent Messages.
- ~~3. Come by Sandburg to pick up any materials that your child needs to complete his/her work. (math pages, iPad, guided reading books, etc.)~~
4. Get on your child's iPad and go to the Canvas (Student) app. Once you are on the teacher's home page, click on the red button that says, "Remote Learning." Follow your teacher's directions for your child's daily assignments on the "Remote Learning" button.
5. Please contact your child's teacher (via Dojo or email) if you have any questions about your child's daily assignments on the Remote Learning button on Canvas.

First Grade:

My child is in quarantine. What should I do?

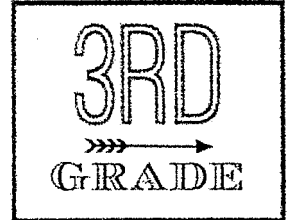

4. Go to Canvas, with your child's iPad, and click on the "Today's Assignments" button. Follow your teacher's directions for your child's daily assignments.

2nd Grade Quarantine Procedures

My 2nd grade child is in quarantine, sick or waiting for the "All Clear" to return. What should I do?

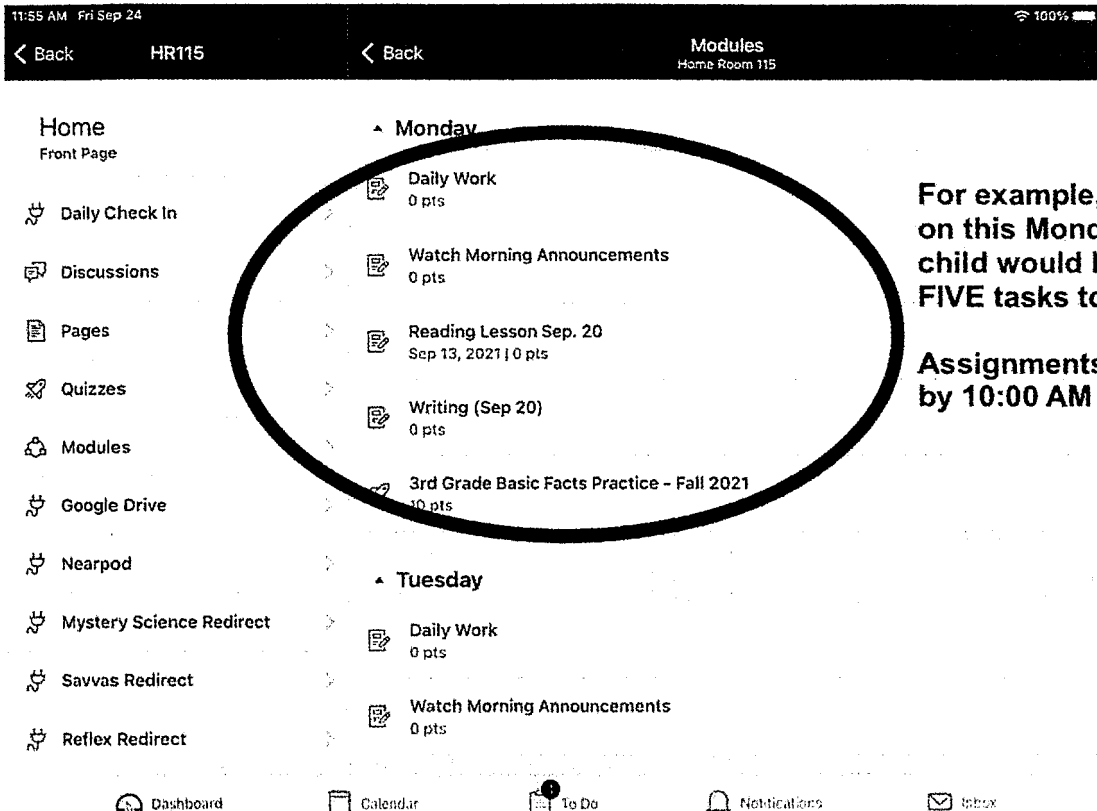
1. Contact your child's teacher to communicate the length of time your child will be gone and why they are absent. This would be a great time to communicate any family situations for daily work time that may need to be addressed. For example, will they be with grandma, babysitter etc.
2. Look at Class Dojo for Parent Messages and Class Story.
3. Pick up any materials from the Sandburg office that your child needs to complete work or let us know if materials need to be brought to your home. (Math workbook, iPad, Reading books, ect.)
4. Check Canvas for assignments to complete.

My child is in quarantine. What should I do?



1. Check Canvas for your daily assignments:
 - a. Once you are on Canvas click on the day of the week.
Complete each assignment listed under the day of the week.

See example of what it would look like on Canvas



For example,
on this Monday, your
child would have these
FIVE tasks to complete.

**Assignments are posted
by 10:00 AM each day.**

2. Contact your classroom teacher through e-mail or through ClassDojo (Mrs. Covey's class) or ClassTag (Mr. Deaton's class) to verify you have found your child's work for the day and ask any questions you may have.
3. Have your child message the teacher through Canvas for any additional questions that they may have throughout the day.

4th/5th Grade Absent Guidelines

My child is in quarantine. What should I do? Follow these steps for success!

1. Your child needs to bring home their 8-pocket, iPad, and math book.
2. Check class DoJo for daily information.
3. Contact your child's homeroom teacher as to how long they will be absent.
4. Login to your homeroom teachers' Canvas page.
5. The **ABSENT** button is found on each teacher's Canvas page. Scroll down to the bottom of each **ABSENT** page to read ALL the information.
6. When your child returns to school, please remind them to turn in their completed work to their teacher.
