In order to fully understand our reports, which includes not only the information the reports provide but also who the information should be communicated to and when, we will be rolling out our reports in two phases.

Phase I: Reviewing Reports to Assist with Parent Conferences and Setting SLOs

MAP Report	Purpose	Intended Audience	When
1.) Student Progress Report	<i>Shows a student's overall progress from all past terms to the selected term so you can communicate about the student's term-to-term growth.</i> <i>Terms = Fall, Winter, Spring</i>	Teacher, Instructional Coach, Department Chair, Assistant Principal, Guidance Dean	Parent Conferences (Traditional calendar: Oct. 26 and 27) Sharing data with students (TBD)
2.) Achievement Status and Growth Report	<i>Shows a student's growth based upon national norms by reporting projections so you can set student growth goals and a summary comparison of two terms so you can evaluate students' growth.</i>	Instructional Staff setting SLOs	Until October 30 th
3.) Class Breakdown by Goal Report	<i>Shows all students' specific areas for instructional focus by goal and RIT score within a chosen subject so that you can modify and focus the instruction for each student within one class.</i>	Instructional Staff setting SLOs	Until October 30 th

1.) Class Breakdown by Goal Report	<i>Shows all students' specific areas for instructional focus by goal and RIT score within a chosen subject so that you can modify and focus the instruction for each student within one class.</i>	Teacher, Instructional Coach, Department Chair, Assistant Principal, Guidance Dean	Data Days Grade Level Planning
2.) Student Profile Report	<i>Brings together the data you need to advise each student and support his or her growth, including learning paths and growth goals.</i>	Teacher, Instructional Coach, Guidance Dean, Student, Parent	Student Goal Setting conferences (TBD) Problem Solving, IEP, and Parent Meetings
3.) Student Goal Setting Worksheet	<i>Shows a student's test history and growth projections in the selected subject areas for a specific period of time so you can discuss the student's goals and celebrate achievements.</i>	Teacher, Instructional Coach, Guidance Dean, Student, Parent	Student Goal Setting conferences (TBD) Problem Solving, IEP, and Parent Meetings
