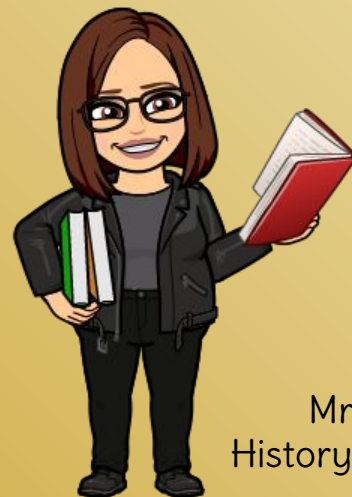

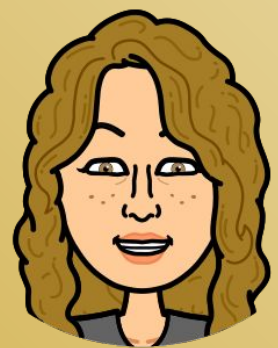

Attendance expectations

- Teachers will take attendance for every student every day.
- Students are expected to participate in Zoom sessions and log onto Canvas to complete learning activities.
- On Synchronous instruction days, students will log into Canvas and then log into their Zoom sessions. Teachers will take attendance during the Zoom session. Students who do not attend the Zoom will be marked absent for the class period.
- On Asynchronous instruction days (all Mondays and two other days per week, based on the students' schedules), attendance will be based on students' Activity Logs on Canvas.
- Students must log into Canvas Monday-Friday and participate in activities that have been assigned to them.
- Teachers will check the Student Activity Log on Canvas and record Attendance by 3:45 pm each day.
If a student has not logged into Canvas for the day, they will be marked absent.
- If you are sick or cannot attend class that day, a parent needs to call the office and let them know. Otherwise, you will be marked unexcused.
