Hybrid Class Vs. Remote Class

- Students are placed based on registration in either a Remote Class or a Hybrid Class.
- Both classes will receive direct instruction and curriculum with delivery styles that could be different based on teacher.



Return to Learn - Schedule

- 8:30-2:00 Schedule with lunch at the same time in the cafeteria.
- Hybrid Students will be on an A/ B schedule.
- Remote Students will continue the same schedule.
- Hybrid will receive 2 days of direct instruction and 3 days of Asynchronous Learning.
- Asynchronous learning days will be similar to Mondays, except Fairview will provide additional small groups. Ex. SEL, Reading and Math Intervention, IEP, etc.



Return to Learn - Schedule WHY?

- Students returning to in person learning- Our classrooms can safely hold 15 people (Adults and Students) to ensure proper social distancing.
- This will allow our Hybrid students to receive targeted direct instruction with a small class size. (Using MAP Data and other information)
- Go slow to go fast.



A Few of The New Safety Protocols

- Car riders, Bus Riders, Walkers Enter our building in 3 locations.
- All students will be screened prior to entering the building.
- Class size including adults is maxed at 15 people, average 9.
- Building will have about 70 students compared to 300.
- Desks are social distant at 6 feet.
- Arrows on our floors.
- The entire building will be sanitized nightly.



A Few of The New Safety Protocols

- New contactless water fountain, students should bring a water bottle.
- Grab and go breakfast in the classroom.
- Bathroom schedules to allow cleaning after each class.
- Assigned lunch seats, 3 per table in the cafeteria.
- Lunch Recess is still a go! No playground equipment yet, but activities per grade.
- More hand and sanitizer stations throughout the building.



What Does a Screening Look Like

- Bus riders will be screened prior to entering the bus, assigned seats with social distancing, and screened exiting the bus.
- Car rider are screened as they exit the vehicle prior to the vehicle leaving
- Walkers are screened prior to entering the building
- Screenings consist of
 - Forehead temperature
 - Visual and verbal symptom check, following IDPH guidelines



What Does a Screening Look Like

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What Does a Screening Look Like

- Anyone with a symptom and or temperature above 100.4 should not be at school.
- If a bus rider or a walker shows up to school with a symptom and or temperature, they will be sent to an isolation room for a grown-up to pick up. Student must be picked up within 30 minutes of the call home.
- If a student shows symptoms or has a temperature they will be sent to an isolation room for a grown-up to pick up. Student must be picked up within 30 minutes of the call home.



What Does is an Isolation Room

- A separate location for students that show symptoms and or a temperature above 100.4.
- There will be a nurse or other staff member with student awaiting grown up pick up.
- The isolation room is equipped with PPE equipment to ensure the safety of multiple students.



Confirmed Cases

- All close contact individuals (anyone under six feet for over a cumulative of 15 minutes) will be notified by the school and will follow the IDPH guidelines.
- Families will be notified if there is a confirmed case of staff or student in the building, and last known date of person in building.



Masks

- Masks are required to be on in the building and on the bus.
- Students will be able to remove the masks while eating and drinking.
